LOCAL RULES

1. Out of bounds
A ball is out of bounds if it comes to rest beyond the nearest inside points of the white posts (at ground level) bounding the course, beyond the nearest inside points of the white posts surrounding the spiny on the right of the 13th and the right of the 16th holes, the practice field on the right of the 1st, 17th and 18th holes, and beyond white posts or under hedge behind the 18th green.

2. Cart Tracks

A ball coming to rest on any cart track on the ramps crossing the 1st, 8th, 9th and 16th fairways maybe pick off and dropped behind without penalty, still in rough if lifted from the rough.

3. All parts are declared by the Committee to be an integral part of the course unless otherwise notified, and such relief can only be taken under penalty. Certain of the paths will qualify for relief under rule 24-26. Immovable obstruction, and these will be listed on the noticeboard.

4. Effort will be made to have all ground under repair marked as such, but in all obvious cases rules of golf shall apply after consultation with marker. N.B. Worn ungrassed areas do not constitute ground under repair.

The mat tees and surrounds must be treated as ground under repair.

Courtesy On The Course

In the interests of all concerned players should play out without delay.

- Do call the game behind through as soon as it becomes apparent that the ball will not be easily found. Do not search for five minutes before doing so.
- Do you leave a ball, club and tee peg ready when it is your turn to play.
- Do prepare to take your shot while your partners are taking theirs and
- Do walk to your own ball directly from your last shot.
- Do leave the putting green and green side before marking cards.
- Do pick up in points competitions when you can no longer score.
- Don't leave your trolley in front of the green.

Remember to keep up with the game in front and not in front of the game behind.
